Sanchez – UBS

- 1) Retreat began with Introductions and Ice-Breaker Activity
- 2) Kevin Sanchez from UBS gave an overview of our portfolio, his role with UBS, and the fiduciary responsibilities of Trustees. The overview was recorded and a sound file of Kevin's complete presentation is available on the ABCF's website.

Highlights from Kevin's presentation:

- When interest rates go up, bond values go down. Interest rates are not going to go any lower. The stock market can turn on a dime, but the bond market turns like an aircraft carrier.
- We have a legal obligation to be responsible fiduciaries. Kevin presents to us on a quarterly basis what is happening in the market, how the various funds are performing and being managed. The board then has the responsibility to choose the actions needed based on Kevin's recommendations.
- Kevin recommends that we rebalance the portfolio back to the prescribed target.
- The Council of Community Foundations (Tab 4 of UBS Report) compiles of list of benchmarks for asset allocations. Rebalancing our portfolio will get us back in line with the allocations of like size foundations.
- For Foundation development purposes:
  - Help others be tax efficient in their giving.
  - Donors can contribute from their IRAs to avoid paying taxes and they still get the contribution benefits.

## **Results from Interactive Sessions:**

Our first session consisted of reviewing recent/current activities of the Foundation to confirm their "added value" to the Avila Beach Communities. Among the activities reviewed were:

- Grant Making is the one area we have, thus far, made the greatest impact, and have expanded the number of projects and organizations funded.
- Avila Alerts is a helpful service that some, but not many, residents have subscribed to. Steps should be taken to encourage more people to register through Avila Community News and ABCF social networking.
- Town Hall Forums remains a good way to engage the community by inviting project developers to provide the public with planning and progress updates.
- ABCF columns in, and mailing of, the Avila Community News continue to be a vital tool for Foundation outreach. It also benefits all local groups who use the publication to publicize their activities and events, as well as businesses that advertise in ACN. P.G.&E. being sought as a partner/funder to continue this service.
- Live Well Symposium considered to be an important educational service, and could be expanded to twice yearly, along with opening it to others outside greater Avila.
- Avila History and Heritage event still seems to be a topic of interest to longtime residents and "newcomers" as well. No particular direction determined for a next session.
- Foundation initiated projects such as the Matching Gifts Initiative, commercial trash bins on the boardwalk cooperative, and purchase/installation of the Avila Pier telescope are great ways to get people involved in community enhancement efforts. Steps should be taken to uncover more such possibilities.

Our second session consisted of small group brainstorming ideas in four different categories as shown below. In addition to the ideas offered by each "team" are those presented earlier by staff.
